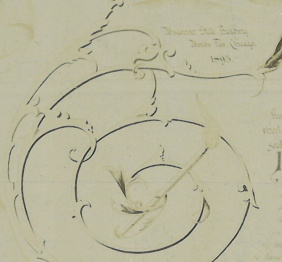


HISTORY OF WISCONSIN.

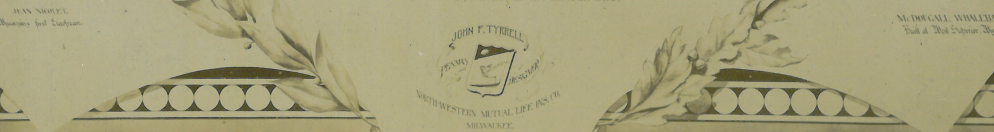
